### Course Description

This 2.5 day course is designed to provide up-to-date problem-solving information for practicing surgical pathologists through the use of didactic sessions, case presentations and discussion periods. The presentations will be organized into organ-based sessions, and will primarily focus on resolution of the most common diagnostic problems facing anatomical pathologists in routine practice. Participants will learn current classifications and diagnostic criteria for a variety of neoplastic and non-neoplastic diseases. It is expected that participants will develop an insight into evolving concepts regarding pathogenesis of various diseases. Differential diagnoses will be discussed at length, and a practical and pragmatic approach to case evaluation will be emphasized. The faculty will integrate morphology with newer diagnostic tests, including immunohistochemistry and various molecular assays. Participants will learn about clinical features of various tumor entities along with pathological prognostic and predictive factors. Adequate time will be allowed for questions and answers. CME and SAM credits will be available for course registrants. Each registrant will receive a syllabus containing comprehensive course materials.

### Statement of Need

The past few years have seen a tremendous increase in the variety and complexity of diseases encountered by surgical pathologists. Recent advances in molecular techniques have led to their widespread application to human disease, particularly with respect to the evaluation of malignancies. This course is designed to address problems that arise during pathologic evaluation of tissue samples, and provide pathologists with a framework for interpretation of both histologic patterns of disease and results of molecular analyses.

### Course Goals and Objectives

It is intended that this Weill Cornell CME activity will lead to improved patient care. At the conclusion of this activity, participants should be able to:

- Improve diagnostic skills in problematic aspects of anatomic pathology.
- Identify, classify, and distinguish between benign, premalignant, and malignant lesions of different organs.
- Apply ancillary tests to evaluation of non-neoplastic and neoplastic diseases.
- Communicate results to clinicians effectively and learn to utilize clinical clues to diagnoses.
